

Inspiration Sheet – Card Box Holder for Notecards

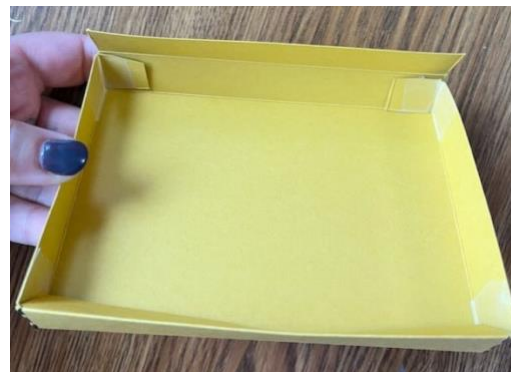
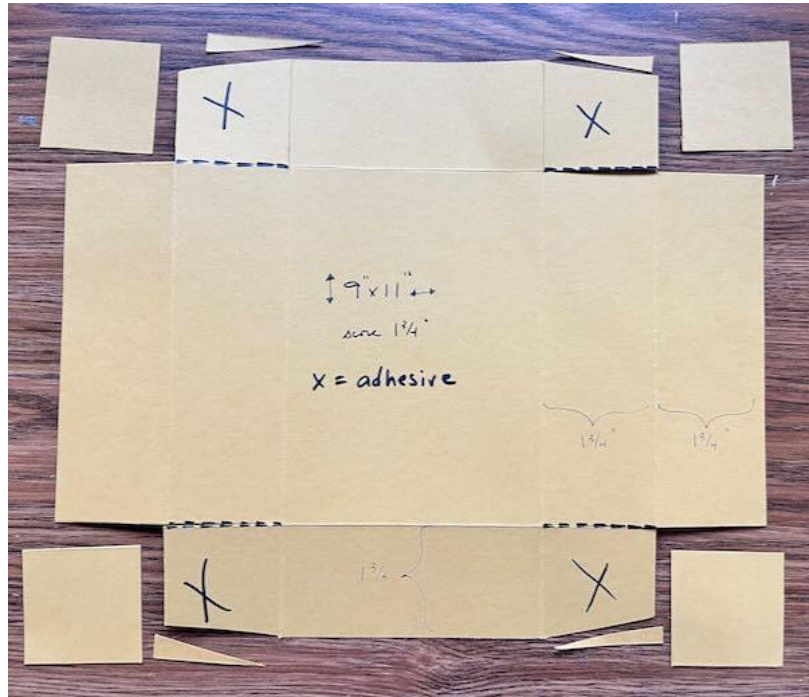
Use this pattern to create a box for 10 notecards and envelopes (A1 size).

Supplies Needed

9" x 11" cardstock for the card box base
 7-1/8" x 7-1/8" cardstock for the card box top
 Scoring Tool or scoring blade on the paper trimmer
 Scissors
 Stampin' Seal+, Tear Tape or Liquid Glue

Directions for the Card Box Base

1. Score the 9" x 11" cardstock along the 11" side at 1-3/4", 3-1/2", 7-1/2" and 9-1/4". Turn the cardstock and score along the 9" side at 1-3/4" and 7-1/4".
2. Fold all the score lines in the same direction (towards one side) and press with a bone folder to sharpen score lines.
3. Cut off the four most outside corners as shown.
4. Cut on the dotted score lines as shown to create the box flaps.
5. With scissors, trim off a tiny triangle on the outside edges of the box flaps. This allows the long side of the box to fold together without interference.
6. Use strong adhesive on the box flaps marked with an X.
7. One short side (of the box) at a time, fold the flaps in and attach to the bottom section of the long side. Do the same on both sides.
8. Attach the top section of the long side to the inside of the box over the flaps with strong adhesive.



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Directions for the Card Box Top

1. Score the 7-1/8" x 7-1/8" cardstock along one of the sides at 3/4" and 1-1/2". Turn the cardstock to the opposite side and score again at 3/4" and 1-1/2".
2. On the 2 remaining sides score at 3/4".
3. Fold all the score lines in the same direction (towards one side) and press with a bone folder to sharpen score lines.
4. Cut off the four most outside corners as shown.
5. Cut on the dotted score lines as shown to create the flaps.
6. With scissors, trim off a tiny triangle on the outside edges of the box flaps. This allows the long side of the box to fold together without interference.
7. Use strong adhesive on the box flaps marked with an X.
8. One short side (of the box) at a time, fold the flaps in and attach to the bottom section of the long side. Do the same on both sides
9. Attach the top section of the long side to the inside of the box over the flaps with strong adhesive.
