## Card Template - Criss Cross Pocket Card 2 Ways

#### **Supplies for Cardstock Version**


- 4.25" x 11" Cardstock 2
- 5.25" x 4" double-sided patterned paper (DSP)
- 3.75" x 5.25" cardstock for insert OR
  - Option: notecard folded in half (5"x7")
- 18" Ribbon
- Scraps to create decor for the card front


### **Supplies for DSP Version**

- 4" x 11" DSP 2
- 3.75" x 5.25" cardstock for insert OR
  - Option: Largest Scalloped Contours die cut with folded card on top (4.5" x 6.5")
- Scraps to create decor for the card front

#### **Directions for Cardstock Version**

- 1. Score the 4.25" x 11" cardstock pieces at 5.5". Lay them next to each other and draw opposite diagonal lines creating a "house" shape.
- 2. With the two pieces layered together, cut one half diagonally from middle score line to outside corner following the drawn lines. This creates 2 opposite diagonal panels that will layer together and cross over to form a pocket.







- 3. Adhere one back panel on top of the other. I love to use Multipurpose Glue for this project.
- 4. Cut the 5.25" x 4" piece of patterned paper in half diagonally and adhere to diagonal panels each showing a different side of the paper.

- 5. Adhere the diagonal panels along the bottom edge, overlapping one over the other. This will create the pocket.
- 6. Decorate the cardstock insert.

A perfectly angled design creates a fun pocket!

#### **Directions for DSP Version**

- 1. Follow steps 1-3 the same way as with the cardstock version using the 4" x 11" pieces of DSP.
- 2. Follow steps 5 & 6 to finish the criss cross pocket.
- 3. Score the cardstock piece, 4.5" x 6.5", at 3.25" to create a small notecard and attach to the large Scalloped Contour die cut.





### **Options to Consider:**

- Use 2 different coordinating DSP panels so that there are two different patterns on the diagonal panels.
- Use the Basic Borders Dies to create fun stitched & shaped edges for the postcard insert.
