



# Inspiration Sheet - Diagonal Split Pocket Card

An easy pocket card for all your gift card-giving occasions.

## Invitation-Sized Version

- 5-1/2" x 8-1/2" cardstock base
- 4-1/4" x 5-1/2" DSP
- 4" ribbon for a knot or 8" for a bow

## Notecard-Sized Version

- 5" x 7" cardstock base
- 3-1/2" x 5" DSP
- 4" ribbon for a knot or 8" for a bow

## Directions

1. Score the card base in half at 4-1/4" for the Invitation version and at 3-1/2" for the Notecard Version.
2. Attach the 4-1/4" x 5-1/2" piece of DSP (or 3-1/2" x 5" ) to the front of the card base.
3. Make a diagonal cut in the card front. This cut can be any angle you want. The first time you create the diagonal cut try measuring 2-1/2" down from the top right corner and measure 1-1/4" up from the bottom left corner and cut between the two marks. The card front is now cut into 2 pieces.
4. Attach the bottom half of the card front to the inside of the card to create a pocket. Use adhesive only on the bottom and side edge.
5. Create a focal point cluster to pop-up and attach to the top half of the card front, overlapping the cut halves (but only attached to the top half).
6. There are 2 options to secure the top half closed.
  1. Punch a small hole along the side edge where the card opens about 1" from the top right corner. Punch through both the card front and the card back (inside of card). Tie a small knot or bow through the holes to secure closed.
  2. Create an accent to the focal point cluster that can be popped-up (on the bottom half) so that the focal point corner/edge can be tucked under it.



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
