# <u>Inspiration Sheet – Five Pocket Card Holder</u>

Create a sweet gift for someone special. (Papercrafting Playdate 133)

### **Supplies**

- 1 piece of 12" x 12" DSP or Two-Tone cardstock
- 5 card bases
  - o 3 5-1/2" x 8-1/2"
  - o 2 4-1/4" x 8-1/2"
- 4" x 4" DSP (2)
- 5-1/4" x 4" DSP (3)
- Punched or die cut shapes for greetings (5)

#### **Directions for the Card Holder & Cards**

- 1. Score the 12 x 12 in half at 6".
- 2. Turn 90 degrees and score 3-1/2" from both the left and right edges.
- 3. Cut on the 6" score line to the 3-1/2" score line on both sides.
- 4. Fold back the corners to meet the 3-1/2" score lines and adhere.
- 5. Fold in half on the 6" score line, then fold in both flaps on both sides. This creates two pockets on each side. Adhere with liquid glue only along the bottom edge of the pockets.
- 6. Adhere the back sides of pockets together along the bottom and one side to create a fifth pocket.
- 7. Create simple one-layer cards by layering the DSP on the card fronts & adding a simple greeting.

### **Additional Information**

- Designer Series Paper works best for the card holder so that it is flexible enough to hold all the cards. Depending on how thick your cards are, you can also stuff envelopes in the pockets. Or gift with 5 envelopes tied together with ribbon.
- Because of the tight fit inside the pockets it is best to make one layer cards without dimension.
