Inspiration Sheet - Word Play with Alphabet Dies

3 Techniques for using alphabet dies.



Supplies Used

- Foam Adhesive Strips or Sheets
- Dimensionals
- Alphabet Party Dies
- Alphabet a la Mode dies
- Banner Sayings Bundle

Technique #1 - Eclipse

The Eclipse technique raises a die cut from a patterned background so that it not only looks like it is floating but you can see a shadow behind it.

- 1. Stamp a background design on a plain cardstock piece (a trimmed quarter 4" x 5-1/2" works great).
- 2. Arrange the alphabet letters to spell a word over the background design and cut out.
- 3. Attach the trimmed quarter to a card base that is a dark cardstock, or just attach a dark cardstock in-between the quarter and the card base. You want to have a dark color in the negative space created by the cut-out dies.
- 4. Attach Foam Adhesive Strips or Stampin' Dimensionals to the backside of the letters, and mount back inside the negative space.



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Technique #2 - Inlaid Dies

- 1. Using a word die or alphabet dies, cut out a shape or design from the trimmed piece of cardstock that will go on the from of the card base.
- 2. Take out the cut shape leaving the negative "hole" and adhere the card front to the card base.
- 3. Cut out the same die shape or design again in a different cardstock or patterned paper using scraps that fit the size of the shape/design die.
- 4. Inlay these shapes or designs into the negative "holes" on the card front.

<u>Tips</u>

- When inlaying thin patterned paper into a card front made of cardstock you may want to attach the patterned paper to Basic White cardstock first before die cutting to keep the thicknesses the same.
- If you are going to be embossing the card front piece of cardstock, do that step after cutting out the die shape/design.



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Technique #3 - Positive and Negative 2 in 1 Cards

- 1. This technique is begins in the same way as technique #2 following steps 1 & 2.
- 2. Use the negative piece on one card base, and the cut out word/letters on another card base.
- 3. The negative piece can be attached directly to the card base or popped up. Be sure to save and use all the letter/word holes to glue back down (you can reinsert the word/letters to use a guide).
- 4. The cut out word/letters can be arranged and popped up on a new card. This is a great opportunity to layer the word/letters with a coordinating cardstock color.
