




Stampin' Inspiration - Hip to be Square #2 Template #34

(Papercrafting Playdate 171)



Supplies

- 5 1/2" x 8 1/2" card base (10)
- 4-3/4" x 3-1/4" cardstock (10)
- 4-3/4" x 3/8" ribbon, cardstock, or die cut edge (10)
- (15-18) 3" squares
- Small Focal Point cluster any shape

Cut the 15-18 3" squares into rectangle and square pieces. For 10 cards you need 24 1-1/2" squares and 18 1-1/2" x 3" rectangles. If using a package of Designer Series Paper that has 6 double sided patterns, Choose one of each of the 6 to cut into 24 squares and 9-12 (two of each) to cut into the 18 rectangles. You will have a few leftovers.

Directions

1. Attach the 4-3/4" x 3-1/4" piece of cardstock to the card front with dimensionals centered along the left side. This is the focal point layer where the different square/rectangle (#1-10) configurations will get attached.
2. Layer the 4-3/4" x 3/8" piece of cardstock, ribbon, or die cut decorative edge along the side of the popped-up main focal point layer.
3. Arrange and attach any of the ten square/rectangle configurations onto the focal point layer leaving an 1/8" margin around the outside.
4. Pop-up a small focal point cluster (greeting) anywhere on the card front.

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
